At both Key Stages, the important thing to note here, is the % of pupils who achieve a **Greater Depth**. This is significantly above in all subjects and in many cases, more than double that of the National Average.

These results are certainly something to be proud of and are a great credit to the teachers, their assistants and supportive parents, who work so hard to enable our children to do their best and achieve their potential.
